JOB DESCRIPTION for Groups Supervisor



OVERVIEW

The **Groups Supervisor** is responsible for ensuring new missionaries establish vital, independent support networks and community involvement, which is the cornerstone of the "Groups" element in SETTLING. This involves connecting participants with appropriate local churches, Bible studies, and relational groups (like men's or women's groups) that match their needs and location. The supervisor ensures every participant finds a crucial sense of belonging and community outside of their ministry team, which is foundational for their emotional health and long-term sustainability on the field. It is full time and support raising or self-funding is required. The role is based out of Bangkok, Thailand.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Church and Fellowship Placement: Assess the needs and location of new missionaries, then actively connect them with appropriate, healthy local churches, Bible studies, and inter-missionary fellowship opportunities.
- Targeted Group Matching: Facilitate the integration of participants into specialized relational groups, such as men's groups, women's groups, or spouse support networks, to build specific peer relationships.
- Community Resource Mapping: Research and maintain an updated list of local community assets, clubs, recreational organizations, and family resources to help missionaries build a life outside of work.
- **Mentorship Program Coordination:** Work in tandem with the TSS Coordinator to ensure every missionary is connected to a long-term mentor for sustained personal and relational guidance over 6–24 months.
- **Isolation Prevention and Check-ins:** Establish a system for proactively monitoring the social well-being of participants, initiating confidential check-ins with those who may be struggling with loneliness or isolation.
- Relational Health Education: Provide resources and consultations on the general principles of building strong, cross-cultural friendships and support circles, emphasizing the value of intentional community.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Must personally embrace <u>GFM's purpose</u>, vision, <u>values</u>. and <u>statement of faith</u>
- Must identify as a maturing believer in Jesus Christ with a high view of Scripture (2 Tim 3:16-17;
 Col 3:16-17)
- Must demonstrate humility, teachability, and an ability to work well with others (Eph 4:15)
- Must display advanced interpersonal relational skills and be dedicated to peacemaking (Heb 10:24-25)
- Must function well both independently and in a team environment (1 Cor 12:25-26)
- Must be able use or learn internal communications and technology systems (Email, Google Drive, Slack, Salesforce, etc.)
- Must be ready to experience significant missions training and discipleship through GFM's Missionary Training School (in person sessions or online)

RECOMMENDED

 A College Degree is preferred but not required; informal training/experience in administration, communications, team building, human resource management, organization, leadership, and/or ministry will be considered
